How to use this guide

The *Travel Wisconsin Activity Guide* is divided into three sections: Fun on the Land, Fun on the Water, and Fun in the Snow. The Table of Contents on page 1 displays the recreational activities included in each of those sections. A detailed map of Wisconsin on page 3 shows the state's major cities and highways. The map divides the state into seven color-coded regions. Information for each activity is arranged alphabetically within each region. The map also shows the location of ten Gateway Visitor Information Centers located at key entrance points to Wisconsin.

More Travel Info Sources

Pages 77 through 79 of this guide provide a list of additional tourism contact information including convention bureaus, chambers of commerce, and county and area tourism offices that are ready and waiting to help you plan your Wisconsin getaway.

Attraction notes

The *Travel Wisconsin Activity Guide* includes the location, phone number, Web site, season and hours of operation for more than 1,000 recreational businesses or facilities. However, there are many other interesting shops, parks, museums, scenic overlooks and attractions that are not listed. As you travel, let your natural curiosity and spirit of adventure lead you to them.

Before driving a long distance to any single business or facility, call ahead to be sure it will be operational when you arrive. Information for this guide was gathered from the Tourism database in May 2010. Things change; days and hours of operation may vary.

Note also that many businesses require travelers to make a reservation. Groups should always call ahead to make reservations and ensure good service.



Look for the leaf. It indicates certified Travel Green Wisconsin destinations that have invested in sustainable practices. In addition, look for helpful "green tips" throughout this guide.

Mobility impaired access

Many Wisconsin recreational businesses provide access for the mobility impaired. However, because the definition of "access" varies from facility to facility, this Guide makes no attempt to identify or qualify that access. Before you travel, call ahead to confirm access.

Historical, heritage and wildlife markers

There are nearly 500 Historical Markers placed along the state's highways and byways. Each tells an interesting and informative Wisconsin story.

Distinctive brown-and-white highway signs mark the location of nearly 300 heritage tourism sites – museums, historic districts and buildings. As you travel, enjoy these highlights of Wisconsin history.

State highways are also marked with signs indicating spots where you can observe Wisconsin's abundant wildlife population. Watch for the signs carrying an outline of binoculars, telling you watchable wildlife is nearby.

Wisconsin also preserves some of its most scenic, lightly traveled country roads for the leisurely enjoyment of bikers, hikers and motorists. Wisconsin's Rustic Roads are marked with unique brown and yellow signs; each is numbered and described online at www.dot.wisconsin.gov/travel/scenic/rusticroads.htm

State Parks and Forests

Wisconsin has 99 state parks, forests, trails and recreation areas. They offer an extensive variety of recreational facilities, as well as diverse and beautiful scenery. Most parks are open year-round; some are seasonal. Daily or annual Park Admission Stickers are required.

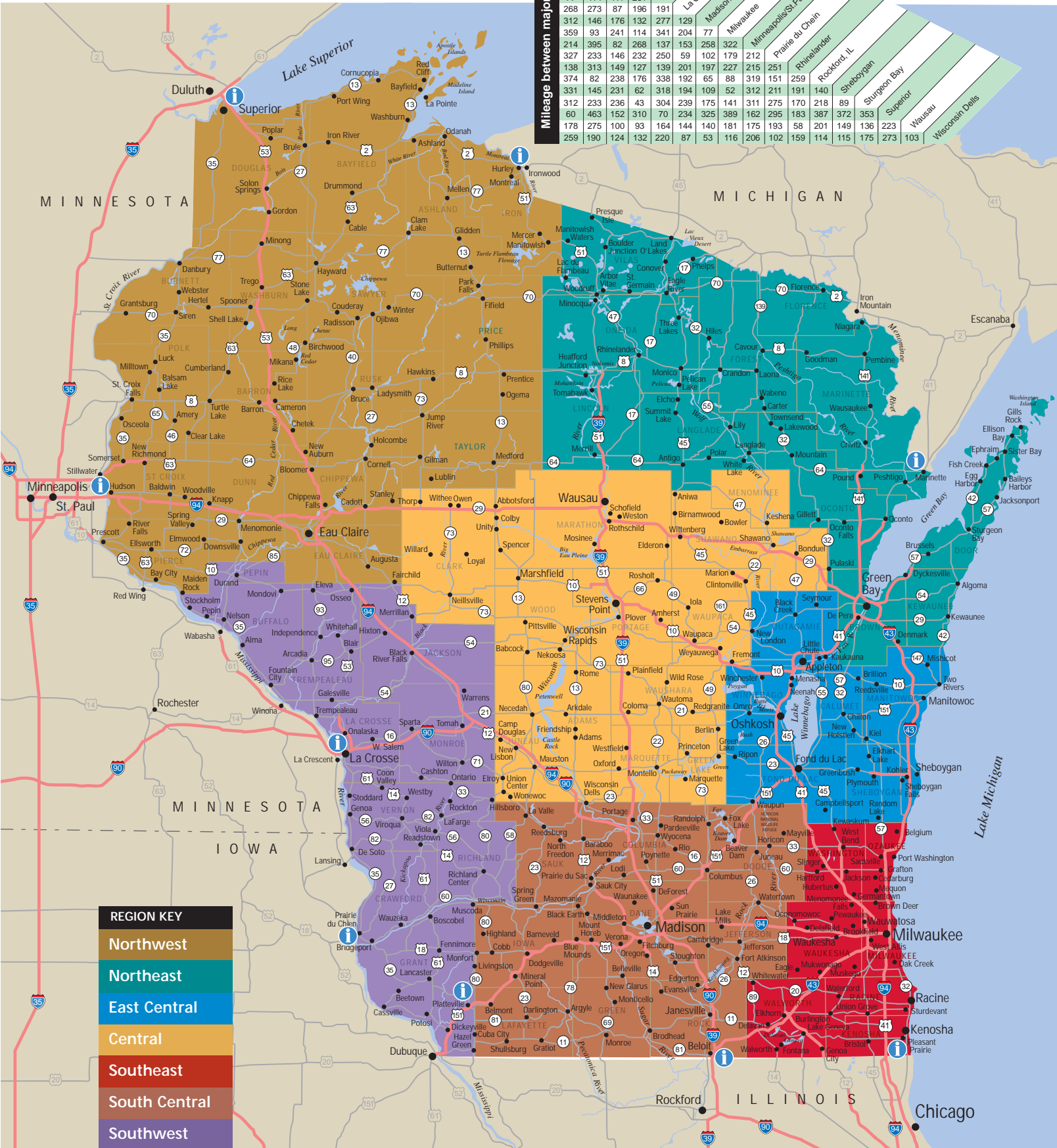

Wisconsin totals 35.8 million acres in the Upper Great Lakes basin. The northern third of the state is heavily forested, while farmland stretches across the fertile central and southern sections.

With more than fifteen million acres of pine and hardwood forest, Wisconsin offers plenty of habitat for wildlife and recreation. Fifty-three state parks and recreation areas, ten state forests and one national forest total more than two million acres of outdoor playground. These parks and forests offer thousands of miles of trails for hiking, biking, horseback riding, ATVing, snowmobiling and cross-country skiing. Campers can choose from 7,000 public and 54,000 private campsites.

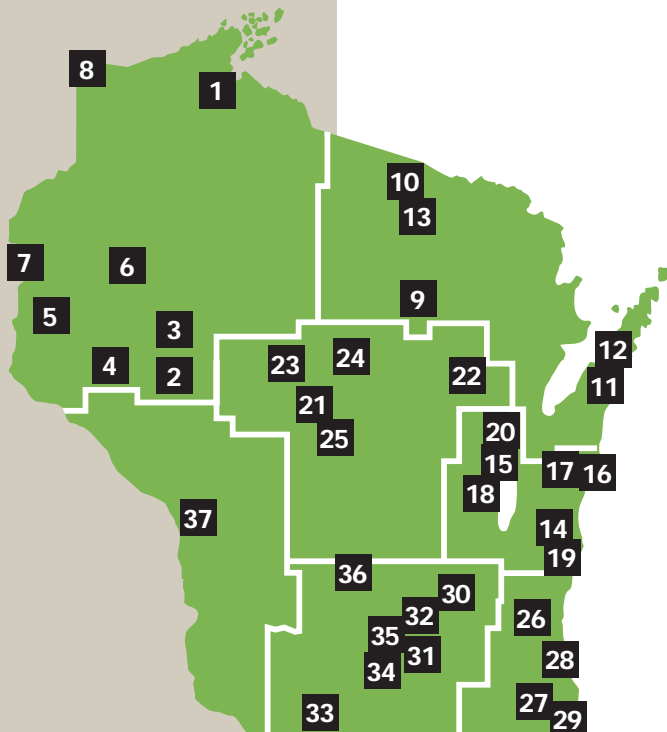
Wisconsin's glacial heritage left some terrific terrain for golf –more than 400 courses are open for public play. Birders can enjoy and record more than 250 avian species. There are waterfalls and lighthouses to explore, breweries and wineries to tour, cheese to sample, and trains to ride.

Experience it all. From the towering limestone bluffs that shoulder the Mississippi to the mysterious sea caves of the Apostle Islands; from the chiseled beauty of the Wisconsin Dells to sunset in the sanctuary of the Horicon Marsh; from the roaring waters of Big Manitou Falls to the soothing cry of a loon on a Northwood's lake, this is Wisconsin.

Auto Racing

Wisconsin is a hotbed of short track racing from street stocks to super stocks in more than forty venues across the state. Many NASCAR drivers cut their teeth on these Wisconsin tracks including 2003 Winston Cup Champion Matt Kenseth and the legendary Dick Trickle with more than 1,200 wins in his 40-year career. Most of the action takes place on weekends – Friday or Saturday nights.

Biking

Here's a list of forty-two designated linear bike-touring trails designed for Wisconsin family fun. All include contact phone numbers; call ahead for trail maps and information. Trail names marked with an asterisk have maps and details available on the Department of Tourism's Web site at travelwisconsin.com.

NORTHWEST

1. CAMBA WILD RIVER TRAIL

Mountain bikes are recommended for this 5-mile loop that includes 2.5 miles on the old Chicago & Northwestern railbed. From the trailhead in Cable the route follows the unimproved railroad grade to a high trestle above the Namekagon River. 800/533-7454.

2. CHIPPEWA RIVER STATE TRAIL*

Connecting Eau Claire on the east with Durand on the west end, this 26-mile mostly hard-surfaced railbed trail plunges deep into the wild bottomland along the Chippewa River. En-route it also connects to the Red Cedar State Trail. 888/523-3866.

3. EAU CLAIRE CITY TRAILS*

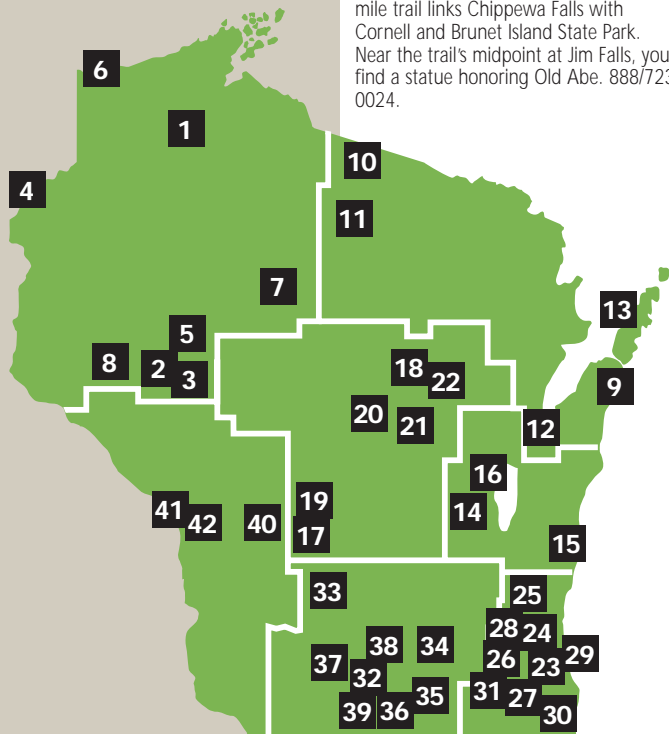
Pedal four miles of paved trails through the city's revitalized downtown. Cross the Chippewa River on an iron trestle, visit museums in Carson Park and the ballpark where Hank Aaron began his professional career. 888/523-3866.

4. GANDY DANCER STATE TRAIL*

Named for the hardy workers who built the railroad and kept it running, this 47-mile crushed-limestone trail cuts across the northwest corner of the state from St. Croix Falls in Polk County to Danbury in Burnett County. 800/222-7655 or 800/788-3164.

5. OLD ABE STATE TRAIL*

Named after the Civil War mascot of the 8th Wisconsin Regiment, this paved 16.9-mile trail links Chippewa Falls with Cornell and Brunet Island State Park. Near the trail's midpoint at Jim Falls, you'll find a statue honoring Old Abe. 888/723-0024.

6. OSAUGIE TRAIL*

This 5-mile asphalt-paved trail is an easy ride along Lake Superior's busy harbor. The trail passes under the massive Burlington Ore Dock, past the Fairlawn Mansion Museum, the S.S. Meteor Museum, and the Richard I. Bong WWII Heritage Center. 800/942-5313.

7. PINE LINE RECREATION TRAIL

A 28-mile trail that follows a former railbed from Medford to Prentice in northcentral Wisconsin. Five miles of the trail have been surfaced with limestone screenings, with the remainder in crushed gravel. 800/269-4505.

8. RED CEDAR STATE TRAIL*

This 15-mile crushed limestone trail traces the Red Cedar River from Menomonie to its junction with the Chippewa River and the Chippewa River State Trail. Highlights include the massive .75-mile-long iron bridge over the Chippewa River. 888/523-3866.

NORTHEAST

9. AHNAPEE STATE TRAIL*

Enjoy the Lake Michigan ports of Sturgeon Bay and Algoma on this 31-mile crushed limestone hiking/biking/horseback-riding trail in Door and Kewaunee counties. 920/746-9959.

10. BATS-CRYSTAL LAKE TRAIL*

Enjoy prime Northwoods lake and forest scenery on the 16-mile asphalt-paved roll between Boulder Junction and Sayner in Vilas County. You'll skirt Trout Lake and pass five state forest campgrounds. 800/466-8759, 888/722-3789.

11. BEARSKIN/HIAWATHA TRAILS*

These crushed-stone hiking/biking trails showcase Northwood's lake and forestland. The Bearskin runs 18 miles south from Minocqua, while the Hiawatha travels 6 miles north from Tomahawk. 800/446-6784 or 800/569-2160.

12. FOX RIVER STATE TRAIL*

The Fox River is Wisconsin's historic gateway to the world. You can follow this water highway on a 14-mile partially asphalt-paved and crushed-limestone railbed trail. Green Bay's many attractions are nearby. 920/448-6242.

13. SUNSET TRAIL*

Winding along the shore of Green Bay in popular Peninsula State Park, this limestone-surfaced 4.4-mile trail lives up to its name with glorious sunsets seen through the bayside cedar trees. 920/868-3258.

EAST CENTRAL

14. MASCOUTIN VALLEY STATE TRAIL

A work in progress, this crushed-limestone railbed trail winds through Green Lake, Winnebago and Fond du Lac Counties. Currently, a 10-mile section links Berlin with Ripon, and a 9-mile section connects Rosendale with the western edge of Fond du Lac. 920/929-3135.

15. OLD PLANK ROAD TRAIL*

This popular 17-mile asphalt-paved trail parallels Hwy 23 between the western edge of Sheboygan and the historic village of Greenbush. The trail follows the route of a pioneer planked road. 800/457-9497.

16. TRESTLE-FRIENDSHIP & WIOWASH TRAIL*

With 31 miles of crushed limestone and paved trails, this is your ticket to Oshkosh, Neenah, Menasha and plenty of quiet countryside. Nearly 1/3-mile long, the trestle spans Little Lake Butte des Morts in Menasha. 800/236-6673, 877/303-9200.

CENTRAL

17. HILLSBORO STATE TRAIL

This 4.3-mile hiking, snowmobile and mountain bike trail runs between Hillsboro and the "400" State Trail at Union Center. Enjoy views of woods, farms and wetlands. 608/489-2350.

18. MOUNTAIN BAY STATE TRAIL*

You can cover nearly half of central Wisconsin on this 81-mile crushed-limestone hiking/biking trail. Passing through Shawano-area vacationland, it connects Wausau and Green Bay. 800/236-3976, 800/235-8528, or 888/948-4748.

19. OMAHA TRAIL*

Tying the I-90/94 community of Camp Douglas with Elroy where it junctions with the "400" and Elroy-Sparta State Trails, this 13-mile hard-surfaced hiking/biking trail traverses beautiful ridge and valley terrain, passes through a tunnel, and crosses a high trestle. 608/847-9389.

20. STEVENS POINT GREEN CIRCLE*

Circling the city of Stevens Point, this 24-mile route combines gravel, natural surface and asphalt-paved trail with on-street links to show off the city's beautiful natural areas. 800/236-4636.

21. TOMORROW RIVER STATE TRAIL*

Covering 21 miles and two distinct landscapes in Portage and Waupaca Counties, this new, crushed limestone trail crosses the sandy plain east of Plover, through the rolling hills of Waupaca County to the pleasant village of Scandinavia. 800/236-4636.

22. WIOUWASH STATE TRAIL - NORTH UNIT

Winding through western Shawano County, this 16-mile crushed-limestone railbed trail links Tigerton with Birnamwood. At the village of Eland, it connects with the Mountain Bay State Trail. 800/235-8528.

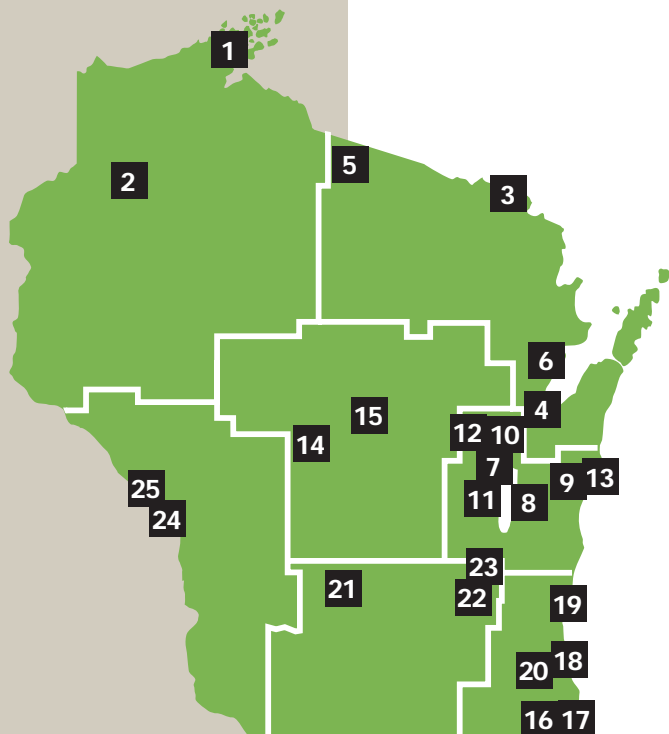

A 4-mile spur of the byway forks west to Butternut Lake on FR2181.

Just south of town, Kohler-Andrae State Park is a scenic gem with 2.5 miles of sandy beaches and magnificent sand dunes. On the north end of the drive, Manitowoc offers the intriguing exhibits of the Wisconsin Maritime Museum. North of the city, Point Beach State Forest beckons the naturalist with 6 miles of shoreline and 17 miles of hiking trails.

From 1,952 feet above sea level at Timm's Hill near Ogemaw, travelers can get a bird's-eye view of a vivid woodland panorama (800/269-4505). Just north of Wild Rose, you can see baby walleye, musky, northern and brown trout at the state fish hatchery, (open Mon-Fri 8-4, Sat & Sun 8-3, 920/622-3527). And in Waupaca, cruise the Chain O' Lakes aboard the Chief Waupaca, then hike 14 miles of trails at Hartman Creek State Park.

Marked by distinctive green and white "Acorn" signs, the Kettle Moraine Scenic Drive is a 75-mile ramble through a riot of oak, maple and aspen fall color in the southern and northern units of the Kettle Moraine State Forests. In the northern unit, 60-foot-tall Parnell Tower and the National Shrine of Mary at Holy Hill offer glorious views of the surrounding glacial terrain. In the southern unit, you can visit Old World Wisconsin, a wonderful collection of 60 historic buildings organized in several ethnically themed pioneer villages.

16. LAKE GENEVA

This pair of Wisconsin Rustic Roads just east of Lake Geneva is loaded with fall color and glacial topography. Designated Rustic Roads to preserve their quiet, back-country character, R-11 and R-36 together offer 15 miles of serenity amid autumn's splendor. From Lake Geneva, travel east on Hwy 50 about 5 miles to its intersection with Cranberry Road/R-11. Continue east on Cranberry Road to Berndt Road, then north to Steele Road, then west to South Road, then south back to Hwy 50. This gently winding route provides excellent views of glacial Kettle Moraine topography, passing through large wooded areas of oak, maple and hickory. (800/345-1020, lakegenewawi.com)

Near Spring Green you can stretch your legs at Frank Lloyd Wright's Taliesin or at the incomparable House on the Rock. Nearby, Tower Hill State Park is named for its shot tower and melting house where much of the lead shot used in the Civil War was manufactured. For panoramic views of the confluence of the Mississippi and Wisconsin Rivers, stop at Wyalusing State Park just south of Prairie du Chien.

It may seem counterintuitive, but I-94 between Tomah and Osseo in west-central Wisconsin is indeed a fall scenic drive favorite. Between Tomah and Black River Falls a series of glacial kames can be seen from the roadway - conical shaped mounds of glacial drift. Just north of Millston, a rest area includes a trail up a kame to a scenic overlook. The Black River State Forest here is particularly colorful in the fall. Between Black River Falls and Osseo, a series of elevation changes display the surrounding countryside in autumn panorama. You can top-off the trip with a slice of pie from the legendary Norske Nook in Osseo.

The Upper Mississippi River Valley is fantastic in fall: a broad ribbon of water shouldered by sandstone bluffs daubed in amber and rust. Further north on Hwy 131, stop atop Wildcat Mountain State Park for terrific high-ground views of the valley in its fall finery.

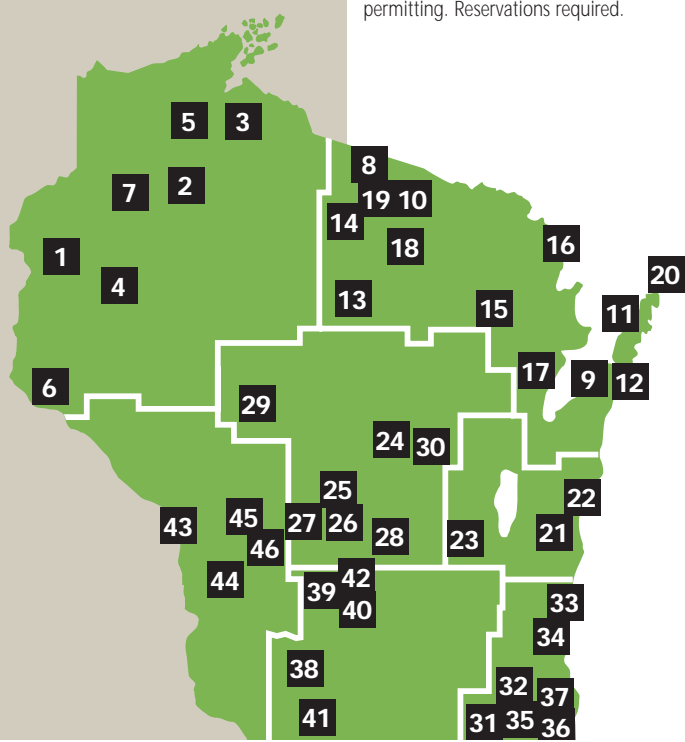

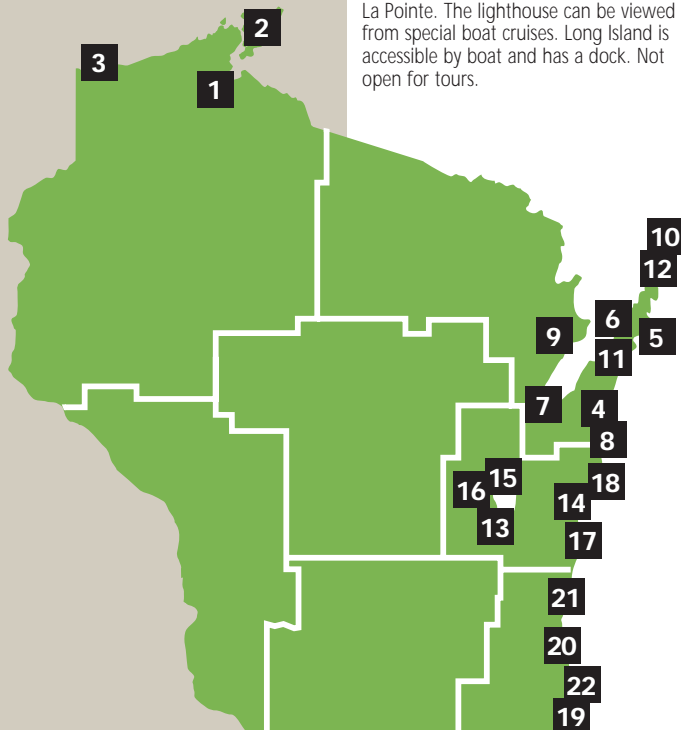

Thirty-five of these historic structures are still standing, adding to the charm of Wisconsin's shores. Many of the lighthouse grounds are open to the public and several of the lighthouses offer tours.

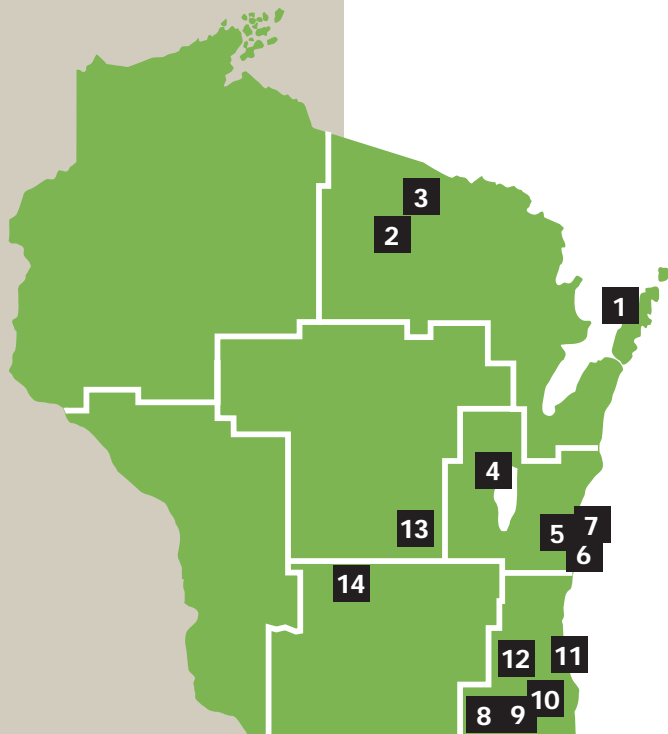

Waterfall Touring

No one knows exactly how many waterfalls there are in Wisconsin. They range in size from 165-foot Big Manitou Falls to 12 feet or less. Whatever their size, many swear that contemplating their wonder can soothe and wash away stress. This list of waterfalls is by no means complete, but shows some of the most spectacular and charming.

NORTHWEST

1. AMNICON FALLS

Located about 10 miles southeast of Superior in Amnicon Falls State Park (call 715/398-3000). The falls drop in a graceful series into the Amnicon River.

2. BIG MANITOU FALLS

Located about 13 miles south of Superior in Pattison State Park (call 715/399-3111). Wisconsin's highest waterfall, it rumbles 165 feet into the Black River. Spectacular scenic overlooks.

3. BROWNSTONE FALLS

Located in Copper Falls State Park (call 715/274-5123) about 5 miles north of Mellen. The falls drop 30 feet into the Tyler Forks River.

4. CASCADE FALLS

This 25-foot falls is located within the city of Osceola on Osceola Creek. The falls is easy to visit and close to many other scenic attractions. A set of stairs leads down into the gorge and to the base of the falls.

5. COPPER FALLS

Located in Copper Falls State Park (call 715/274-5123) about 5 miles north of Mellen. The falls drop 40 feet into the Bad River.

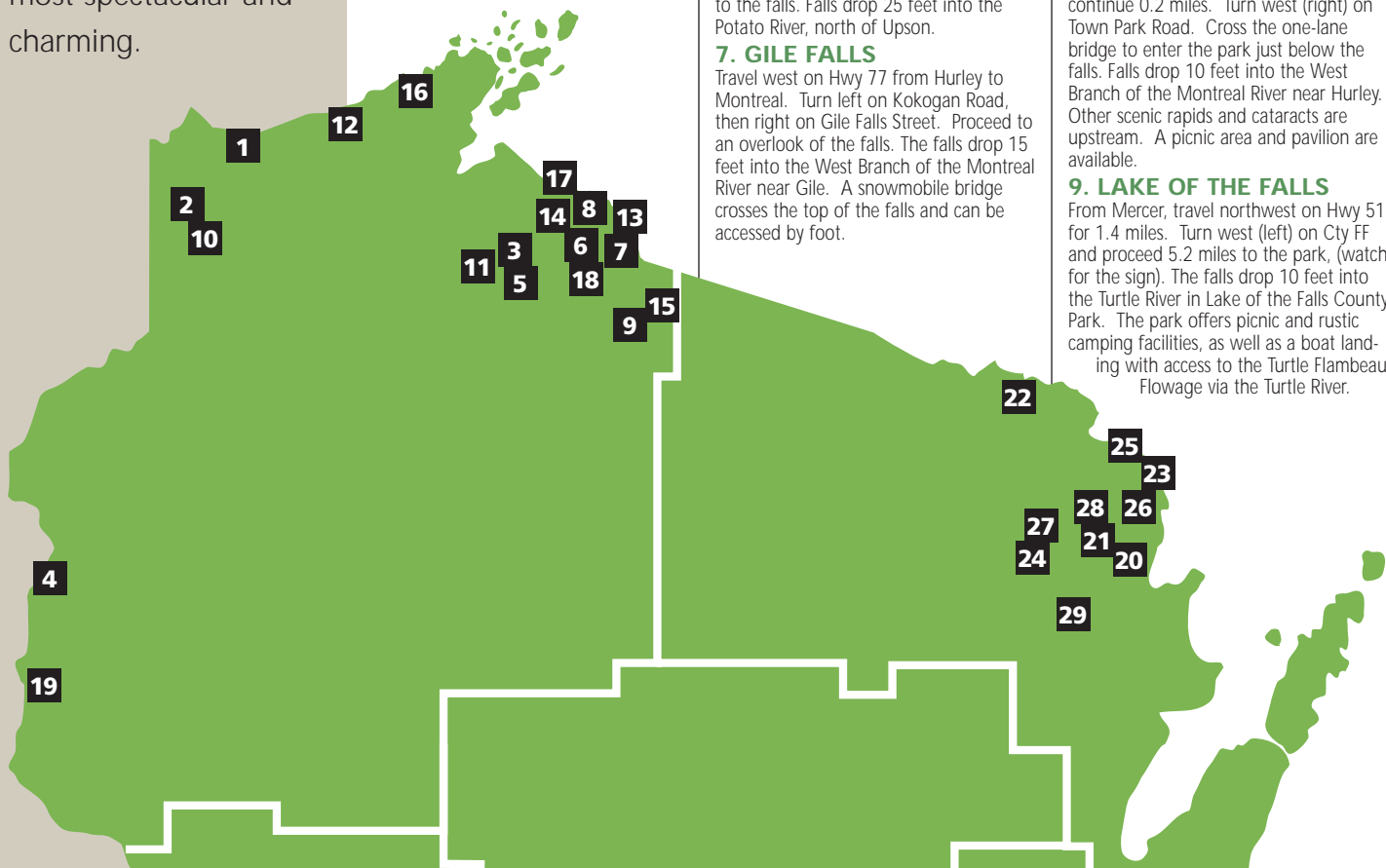
Travel west on Hwy 77 from Hurley to Montreal. Turn left on Kokogan Road, then right on Gile Falls Street. Proceed to an overlook of the falls. The falls drop 15 feet into the West Branch of the Montreal River near Gile. A snowmobile bridge crosses the top of the falls and can be accessed by foot.

8. KIMBALL FALLS

Travel west from Hurley on Hwy 2 for 3 miles. Turn south (left) on Park Road and continue 0.2 miles. Turn west (right) on Town Park Road. Cross the one-lane bridge to enter the park just below the falls. Falls drop 10 feet into the West Branch of the Montreal River near Hurley. Other scenic rapids and cataracts are upstream. A picnic area and pavilion are available.

9. LAKE OF THE FALLS

From Mercer, travel northwest on Hwy 51 for 1.4 miles. Turn west (left) on Cty FF and proceed 5.2 miles to the park, (watch for the sign). The falls drop 10 feet into the Turtle River in Lake of the Falls County Park. The park offers picnic and rustic camping facilities, as well as a boat landing with access to the Turtle Flambeau Flowage via the Turtle River.

10. LITTLE MANITOU FALLS

Located about 13 miles south of Superior in Pattison State Park (call 715/399-3111). The falls drop 30 feet into the Black River. The falls are split, very scenic and the highlight of the park.

11. MORGAN FALLS

Located 12 miles west of Mellen in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (call 715/264-2511). From Mellen, drive northwest 9 miles on Hwy 13 to Minersville, then west on Cty C and Midway Road to County Line Road. Turn south on County Line Road 4.2 miles to the parking lot. The falls drop 80-100 feet into an unnamed tributary of Morgan Creek. Morgan Falls is a 1.2 mile round trip hike from the parking lot and is an easy hike for everyone. The falls itself is an elegant cascade, diagonally traversing a 70 foot granite face. In the winter only a trickle of a stream flows through the frozen falls. For a quick scenic snowshoe jaunt, Morgan Falls is a good choice.

12. ORIENTA FALLS

Located at the Orienta Dam on the Iron River in northern Bayfield County.

13. PETERSON FALLS

Take Hwy 2 west of Hurley 0.6 miles to a gravel road at the Ero Nasi Construction sign. Follow the road straight east, (don't take any side roads), 0.3 miles and park in a small turn-around. Follow the foot path on the north side of the parking area 1/4-mile to the falls. Remote location. The falls drop 35 feet into the East Branch of the Montreal River north of Hurley.

14. POTATO RIVER FALLS

From the intersection of Hwy 2 and Hwy 169, travel 2.8 miles south on Hwy 169 through the Town of Gurney. Turn west on Potato River Falls Road for 1.5 miles. One of the most beautiful falls in the Midwest. Drops 90 feet into the Potato

River southwest of Gurney. Town park with rustic campsites and a picnic area is available.

15. SHAY'S DAM FALLS

From Mercer, travel east 2.5 miles on Cty J. Turn north (left) on Beaver Lodge Circle. Travel 3.6 miles, past Beaver Lake Rd. Turn east (right) on Fisher Lake Road. Travel 1.2 miles to a small side road on the left leading to Shay's Dam; watch for the sign. Falls drop 15 feet into the Turtle River about 6 miles northeast of Mercer. A park with picnic area is available.

16. SISKIWIIT FALLS

Located about 1 mile east of Cornucopia on the Siskiwit River.

17. SUPERIOR FALLS

Take Hwy 122 north of Hwy 2 approximately 4.2 miles. You will cross the Wisconsin/Michigan border. Continue another half-mile, then turn left on a gravel road. A parking area is available. The falls drop 90 feet into the Montreal River near its mouth on Lake Superior. The falls are an Iron County Heritage Site.

18. UPSON FALLS

From Hwy 77 turn north at the Upson Town Park sign, then left at the end of the street. After crossing the river, turn left into Upson Town Park. The falls drop 18 feet into the Potato River just north of Upson. Camping and a picnic area are available in the park.

19. WILLOW FALLS

Located in Willow River State Park, this 45-foot falls is one of the most scenic waterfalls in the state. The falls is 100-foot wide and consists of several drops, the largest being about 15 feet. A dam was removed from the location in 1992 and the falls and gorge have been returned to their natural state. The park is located five miles northeast of Hudson on County Road A. A state park sticker is required.

NORTHEAST

20. DAVE'S FALLS

Located about 1/2 mile south of Amberg on the Pike River in Dave's Falls County Park (\$2 entrance fee). The park offers a great picnic area, restroom facilities and a playground.

21. HORSESHOE FALLS

Located on the Pike River about 9 miles southwest of Pembine. Just south of Twelve Foot Falls. Accessible from a small parking area and a trail to the falls.

22. LASALLE FALLS

The falls is accessed from County Road C by turning north on LaSalle Falls Rd. This road is 10.2 miles east of State Road 101 or 1.9 miles west of County Road U. LaSalle Falls Rd leads northwest 2.4 miles to a small parking lot on the north side of the road. From the parking lot a trail leads northward for 1 mile to the falls. About .4 miles into the trail a small creek runs eastward; during periods of high water crossing it may be difficult. Located on the Pine River. The area adjacent to the falls is state owned; camping is not permitted on state lands except at designated sites. From the roadside parking lot, the falls is accessed via a 1-mile trail.

23. LONG SLIDE FALLS

Located on the Pemebonwon River about 4 miles northeast of Pembine. The falls cascade about 50 feet through the rocks. Very scenic. You can hike to Smalley Falls, located about 1/2 mile northwest.

24. MCCLINTOCK FALLS

Located on the Peshtigo River about 15 miles west of Amberg in McClintock Park (entrance fee \$2). The falls is a series of rapids with bridges offering exceptional views.

25. PIERS GORGE

Located on the Menomonee River about 9 miles north of Pembine near Hwy 8 at the Wisconsin/Michigan border.

26. SMALLEY FALLS

Located on the Pemebonwon River about 4 miles northeast of Pembine. Just west of Long Slide Falls. Accessible from a small parking lot and trail to the falls.

27. STRONG FALLS

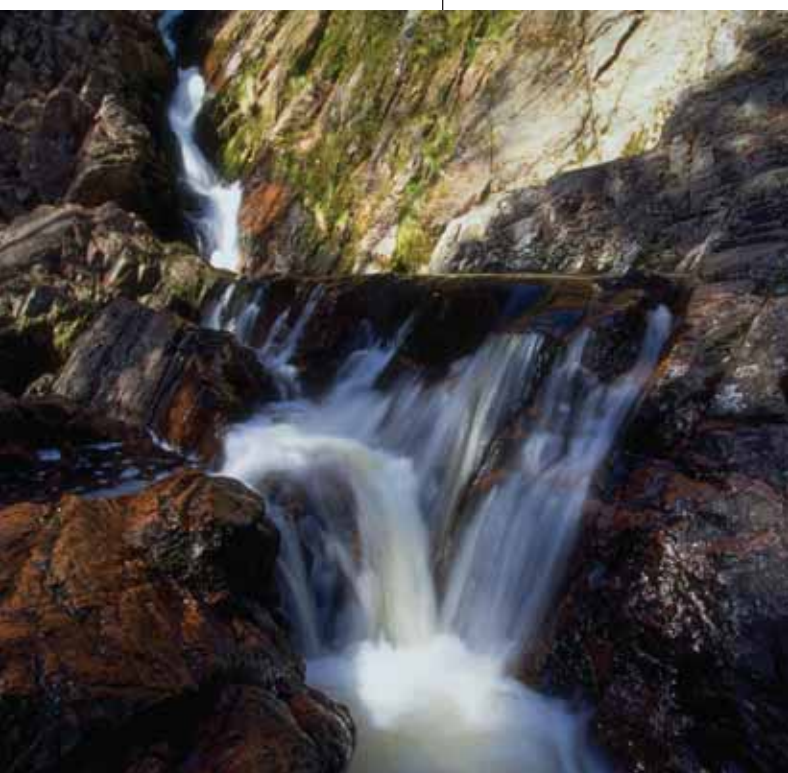
Located on the Peshtigo River about 15 miles west of Amberg in Goodman Park (entrance fee \$2). Picturesque park with camping facilities, a picnic area and playground.

28. TWELVE FOOT FALLS

Located on the Pike River about 8 miles southwest of Pembine at Twelve Foot Falls County Park (entrance fee \$2). The park offers camping and picnic areas, trout fishing and terrific scenic beauty. A five-minute walk through the camping area brings you to Eight Foot Falls. About a mile north of the park you can visit Eighteen Foot Falls.

29. VETERAN'S FALLS

Located on the Thunder River about 10 miles west of Crivitz in Veteran's Memorial Park. The park offers a wooden bridge, camping and picnic facilities.

Canoe Rivers

Native Americans in sleek birchbark canoes were the first to ply Wisconsin's wilderness rivers. Today, you can experience the same beauty and excitement when you canoe or kayak Wisconsin. Wisconsin rivers come in all shapes and sizes. They offer great adventure for beginners and experts alike. The following list is a guide to the state's more prominent waterways prepared in part by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.



NORTHWEST

1. APPLE RIVER

Upper portion is narrow with steady current through pine forests; lower stretch passes through Powell Marsh narrowing again before joining the Manitowish River as it enters the Turtle-Flambeau Flowage. Low hazard riffles. Several access points off town roads.

3. BOIS BRULE RIVER

World-famous for trout fishing, scenery and exciting rapids. Canoe trips can start at Stone's Bridge (Cty S) and proceed upstream or downstream. Upstream, there are no rapids. Downstream trips can end at canoe landings near Cty B, the ranger station, or at Hwy 2. The rapids between Cty B and Hwy 2 are more difficult than those found above Cty B. Canoe trips beyond Hwy 2 require another day to reach the river's mouth on Lake Superior. NOTE: A section below the Hwy 2 bridge contains dangerous rapids which no party should attempt unless accompanied by a knowledgeable guide. There are two state forest campgrounds located along the river.

4. CHIPPEWA RIVER

Rich in history and scenic beauty, the river is navigable for most of its length from the Holcombe Flowage south to the Mississippi River. Water levels are occasionally subject to rapid fluctuation - check locally. The 40-mile stretch below the dam at Eau Claire is generally gentle to moderate with adequate flow. Random portages may be necessary in dry weather or late on Sunday when dams up-river are drawn-up. Access is available at road crossings and developed landings. The last twelve miles run through the 13,000-acre Tiffany Wildlife Area.

5. FLAMBEAU RIVER

One of the best whitewater rivers in the Midwest. The north fork provides the most stable water flow, traversing five Wisconsin counties as it falls from the Willow to the Holcombe Flowage. Along its upper reaches, the eighteen miles from the Turtle Dam to Park Falls are rated Intermediate to Expert with many Class I & II rapids. The southern sections also provide the challenge of rapids and whitewater. The most traveled stretch is from Nine Mile Creek to Ladysmith. There are campsites and landings along the way in the Flambeau River State Forest. The Upper Flambeau above Nine Mile Creek and the stretch below Ladysmith to its junction with the Chippewa are also canoeable. Access is available at road crossings, impoundments and old logging roads.

6. MONTREAL RIVER - WEST BRANCH

For most of its length, the Montreal River forms the border between Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Under high-water conditions, it is one of the Midwest's most challenging whitewater kayak rivers. Site of the 1994 ICF Junior World Kayak Championships. Water levels fluctuate greatly by season. Class II-Class V rapids and numerous falls. The lower portion flows through 300' deep Montreal River Canyon. Take out at Hwy

122 near Lake Superior. NOTE: This river has not been officially surveyed. For expert kayakers only. Low-water conditions make the river impassable.

The Red Cedar runs 60 miles from Chetek to the Chippewa River below Menomonie. Fishing is good all along the river. Access is available at numerous county parks. Canoe rentals are offered at many towns along the river.

The Riverway Visitor Center in St. Croix Falls will help you plan your canoe trip.

Flows across central and east-central Wisconsin to Green Bay. The current is slow with large areas of lake and marsh canoeing above Lake Butte des Morts. Access is available at many parks along the river. The Fox is navigable below Lake Winnebago, but recreational boat traffic is heavy.

14. MANITOWISH RIVER

A river for variety and fun for canoeing, kayaking and tubing. Flows from the lake area southwest of Manitowish Waters (High Lake in Boulder Junction), through the Manitowish chain of lakes, to the Turtle-Flambeau Flowage in Iron County. The upper portion connects 25 lakes including the famous Manitowish Chain of Lakes. With numerous access points, boat landings, and more than 50 canoe-in (overnight) campsites, paddlers can design trips of any length. Downstream, the lower portion is steady current flowing through beautiful north country into the flowage. Great opportunities for wildlife viewing, especially eagles. Low to medium-hazard rapids and riffles. Canoe rentals and access maps available locally.

15. MENOMINEE RIVER

Forming the eastern boundary of Marinette County, the Menominee separates Wisconsin from the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. The upper stretch offers fast water and difficult rapids. Many rapids and dams must be portaged. NOTE: Portions of the upper river are extremely dangerous and should only be run by experts in decked boats. The lower river has a slower current with some low-hazard rapids.

16. OCONTO RIVER

Can be canoed its entire length. The northernmost section above Chute Pond (south of Mountain) features 15 rated rapids. Water levels must be medium high or above and should be checked locally.

NOTE: Because of difficult whitewater and obstacles, this section should not be attempted by a novice. The river below Chute Pond continues moderately to its mouth on Green Bay.

17. PESHTIGO RIVER

In northern Marinette County, the upper portion of the Peshtigo flows through the beautiful Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. It has some of the most difficult whitewater in the midwest. The river above Caldron Falls Reservoir, (City C), has long and difficult rapids that require a high degree of canoeing skill. Water levels should be medium high or above. Below Crivitz, the river slows and widens in sharp contrast. Reservoirs on the central river provide lake canoeing.

18. PINE RIVER

The Pine River flows through northern Forest and Florence Counties to meet the Menominee west of Niagra. A state-designated wild river, it courses through some of the most primitive areas in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. Spring and early summer are the best times to canoe as water levels drop significantly in the summer. Several rapids challenge the canoeist: a few require portages.

20. TOMAHAWK RIVER

The upper Wisconsin River (Vilas-Oneida County to Merrill) is a relaxing way to view the natural beauty of the Northwoods. Winding through forest and farmland, the majority of the river offers a slow current with few obstacles. There is one portage at the Rainbow Lake Dam. Rainbow Rapids offer some excitement, but the rocks are usually submerged.

22. UPPER WOLF RIVER

Offers variety, with relatively calm upper stretches to exciting whitewater below Lily. The stretch below Lily is recommended for experienced canoeists and is also popular for whitewater rafting. NOTE: Regulations on canoeing beyond Markton should be checked locally.

Navigable, shallow waters begin at the Broughton Sheboygan Marsh and flow 25 miles to Lake Michigan. The marsh portion is accessible via Marsh Lodge, W7039 Cty SR near Elkhart Lake. There's a dam at the lower edge of the marsh. To canoe the lower section of the river, maps and a shuttle service are available at Thill Marine, 823 Commerce Ave, Sheboygan. You can also put in at Rochester Park in Sheboygan Falls and travel 13 miles to Sheboygan with 2 portages around dams.

CENTRAL

24. BLACK RIVER

While the upper portions are considered too rocky for navigation, canoeing is popular on the central stretch through Jackson and Clark Counties. Below the dam, put in at the canoe landing at Third Street and enjoy a gorgeous 30-mile ride to New Amsterdam. Canoe rentals are readily available along the route. The current is slow and access is available at road crossings.

25. LEMONWEIR RIVER

Navigable from western Juneau County, (Cty H), to its mouth on the Wisconsin River south of the Hwy 82 bridge. The current is generally moderate to slow; portages are necessary at two dams. A number of sloughs near the mouth make it difficult to keep on the main channel.

26. LOWER WOLF RIVER

Although it has a steady current and wild appearance, the lower Wolf lacks the rough water characteristics of its upper stretches. Public landings are located in Shawano, Shiocton and New London. In the New London area, beginners can rent fiberglass canoes and tubes for family fun on both the Wolf and Little Wolf rivers. A trip down the lower Wolf can be continued through Lakes Poygan and Butte des Morts to Lake Winnebago. The river is well-known for spring walleye and white bass fishing.

27. WAUPACA CHAIN O' LAKES/CRYSTAL RIVER/WAUPACA RIVER

A popular area for beginners. Lake canoeing is available on any of the 23 connecting lakes in the Chain 'O Lakes. Access is available at road crossings.

The upper river is open with clearance around log jams. The lower river from the Hwy 11 bridge to the state line is navigable, but be prepared to portage fallen trees.

By late November, Wisconsin's nighttime temperatures have fallen below freezing. Downhill skiing and snowboarding facilities begin to make snow and will continually add to their base throughout the season, regardless of the natural snowfall. Many ski areas open in early December and all are in full swing for the Christmas holidays.

By mid-December, average daily temperatures in Wisconsin have fallen below freezing. Ice has formed on lakes and ponds and thickens with each passing day. Generally, snow depths throughout the state are adequate for crosscountry skiing and snowmobiling. Ice fishing can start as early as mid-December in the north and early January in the south.

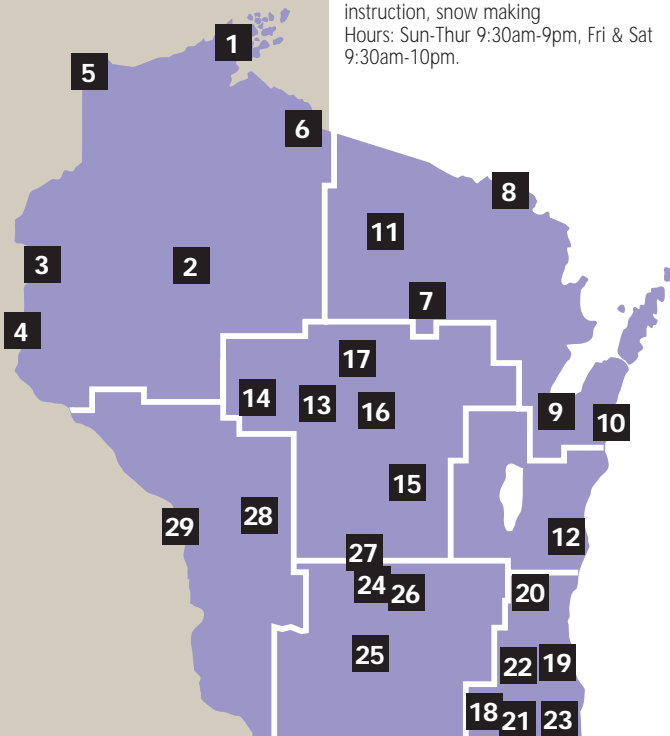
The average annual snowfall in Wisconsin, statewide, is 46.3 inches. Snowfall is heaviest in January, averaging 10.6 inches, while December, February and March each average about 9 inches. Wisconsin's snow cover lasts through March and even into early April in the northern third of the state.

Wisconsin's relatively mild winter temperatures coupled with four months or more of solid snow cover make the state a true winter playground!
